



Rocketship students take the MAP assessment in the fall, winter, and spring. Our Rocketeers grow more than a full grade level in a single school year, ever year. Last year, our new Rocketeers grew an average of 1.62 grade levels in math and 1.43 in reading.



The New York Times reports, "Racial and socioeconomic achievement gaps will most likely widen because of disparities in access to computers, home internet connections and direct instruction from teachers."

Regular, bilingual wellness check for families. Texted daily (spring), bi-weekly (fall due to parent feedback), connecting families to rent assistance, food resources, tech help, etc.

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




2018-19 CAASPP: Percent Met or Exceeded StandardSocioeconomically Disadvantaged Students, Math Grades 3-5

Rocketship Futuro Academy: one of the 26 public elementary schools in the Bay Area recognized as closing the gap for low-income Latino students in math.


