The members of the Delegate Assembly Election Tellers Committee met on March 24 to count and certify the ballots for membership on the CSBA Delegate Assembly. A tie vote resulted in your subregion.

Enclosed is the run-off ballot material for election of a representative to CSBA Delegate Assembly from your subregion. The material consists of the ballot (on turquoise paper) and the candidate's biographical sketch form. In addition, we are including a "copy" of the ballot on white paper so that it may be included in board agenda packets, if you choose to do so. Only the ballot on turquoise paper is to be completed and returned.

The board, as a whole, votes using the turquoise ballot. The ballot must be completely filled out, signed by the Superintendent or the Board Clerk and returned in the enclosed envelope; if the envelope is misplaced, you may use your stationery; please write **DELEGATE ELECTION** – **RUN-OFF BALLOT** prominently on the envelope with the subregion number on the bottom left corner. **Ballots must be** postmarked by the U.S. Post Office on or before *Sunday*, *April 30*, *2017*. *No exceptions are allowed*.

The ballots will be counted no later than May 10, and the candidates involved in the run-off election will be notified immediately of the results. Should a second tie occur, then the Regional Director will cast the tie-breaking vote.

All re-elected and newly elected Delegates will serve two-year terms beginning April 1, 2017 – March 31, 2019. The next meeting of the Delegate Assembly is on Saturday, May 21 – Sunday, May 22 at the Hyatt Regency in Sacramento. Why are you interested in becoming a Delegate? Please describe the skills and experiences you would bring to the Delegate Assembly.

I am interested in becoming a Delegate because I believe "policies matter" and that the CSBA Delegate Assembly is the most important venue to form and advocate for policies for our children. I have stood for children during my many years as a parent/advocate, my thirty years as an adult school teacher and my ten years on the school board. I have chaired, co-chaired and otherwise supported initiatives focused on increasing district resources (through both parcel taxes and bond measures) for the children in my community. In addition, I have colloborated with both county and state officeholders and groups to address finding integrated approaches to social problems faced by many of our children. I have worked with labor and industry groups to develop a coordinated approach to career training (from my background as a Career Tech instructor). I am collaborative, thoughtful and focused on all our children's needs.

I have served on my local board (28,000 students) since 2006. I have been President (twice), Clerk (twice) and served on the following board sub-committees: Academic, Facilities, Safety and School Climate, Citizens Budget Advisory Committee, Ad Hoc Teacher Housing Committee, and as liaison to our Citizens Bond Oversight Committee and the Richmond Promise Steering Committee. In addition, I served on the Executive Board and as President of the Contra Costa County School Boards Association.

In our local community, I am a member of the El Cerrito Lions, a member of the West Contra Costa League of WomenVoters (Executive Committee member), and President of the League of Women Voters - Bay Area Region.

What do you see as the biggest challenge facing governing boards and how can CSBA help address it?

I believe the biggest challenge facing governing boards today is the overall lack of resources available to educate ALL of California's children. I believe CSBA must double-down on its current approach regarding advocacy - both in the courts and at the ballot box. I see the passage of Prop 55 as a sign that California voters are open to supporting additional funding streams for education and I believe CSBA needs to partner with other stakeholders and lead in bringing the funding issue front and center to voters.
