

Goal 1:

Process:

Identification process

- Grant eligibility shall be determined based on the weighted average, as calculated by the State Department of Education, of the 2018 and 2019 results on the consortium summative assessment in English language arts specified in Section 60640 of the Education Code.
- Except as provided in subparagraph (E), the local educational agency shall, for each of its eligible schools, conduct a **root cause analysis and needs assessment**...
- Based on the root cause analysis and needs assessment, the local educational agency shall develop a three-year local educational agency **literacy action plan**...


DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills)











DIBELS

- Overall, we are seeing a decrease in the percent of students that need Intensive (Pull-out) instruction
- We are strengthening our Phonics / Phonemic Awareness Program next year by implementing Fundations.
- We are making growth, which is fantastic. DIBELS gives us a more focused view of student performance which is why we are adopting Fundations.
