Please describe your activities and involvement on your local board, community, and/or CSBA.

I have worked in education for over 40 years as a teacher, counselor, principal, and curriculum specialist at the district level. My doctoral dissertation was focused on high performing school boards. On my board since 2004, we have focused on improvement of student achievement, school facilities, and our board functioning. We have worked with our community to pass facility bonds and we have improved our student achievement and graduation rates. CSBA has helped with this improvement. All board members are MIG graduates and my service as a Delegate and a Director (2009-2013) gave us access to resources and best practices. I have served on several committees and task forces at CSBA, including Annual Conference, Nominating Committee, and Leg. Policy.

What do you see as the biggest challenge facing governing boards and how can CSBA help address it?

As boards, our biggest challenge is moving from person-dependent organizations to organizations with institutionalized systemic approaches. Too often districts suffer "whiplash" when new board members or superintendents arrive. Sadly, while we use CSBA to update policies, we do not use them and other key governing documents (job descriptions, curriculum guides, or strategic plans) to guide our daily practices. Too often these documents exist, untouched, in binders or electronic files. They are not used to guide organizational efforts and/or change. Change is inevitable within any organization, but it should be purposeful change, not drifting based upon current personalities. CSBA can provide this guidance and it is sorely needed.
