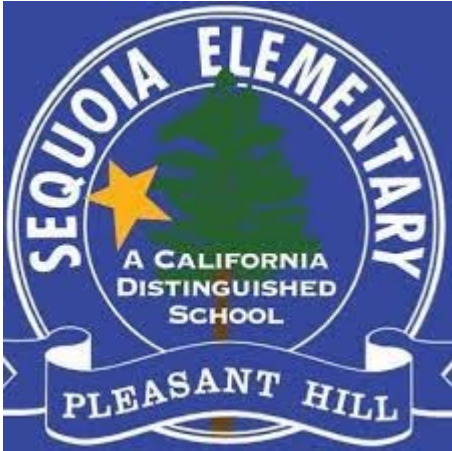
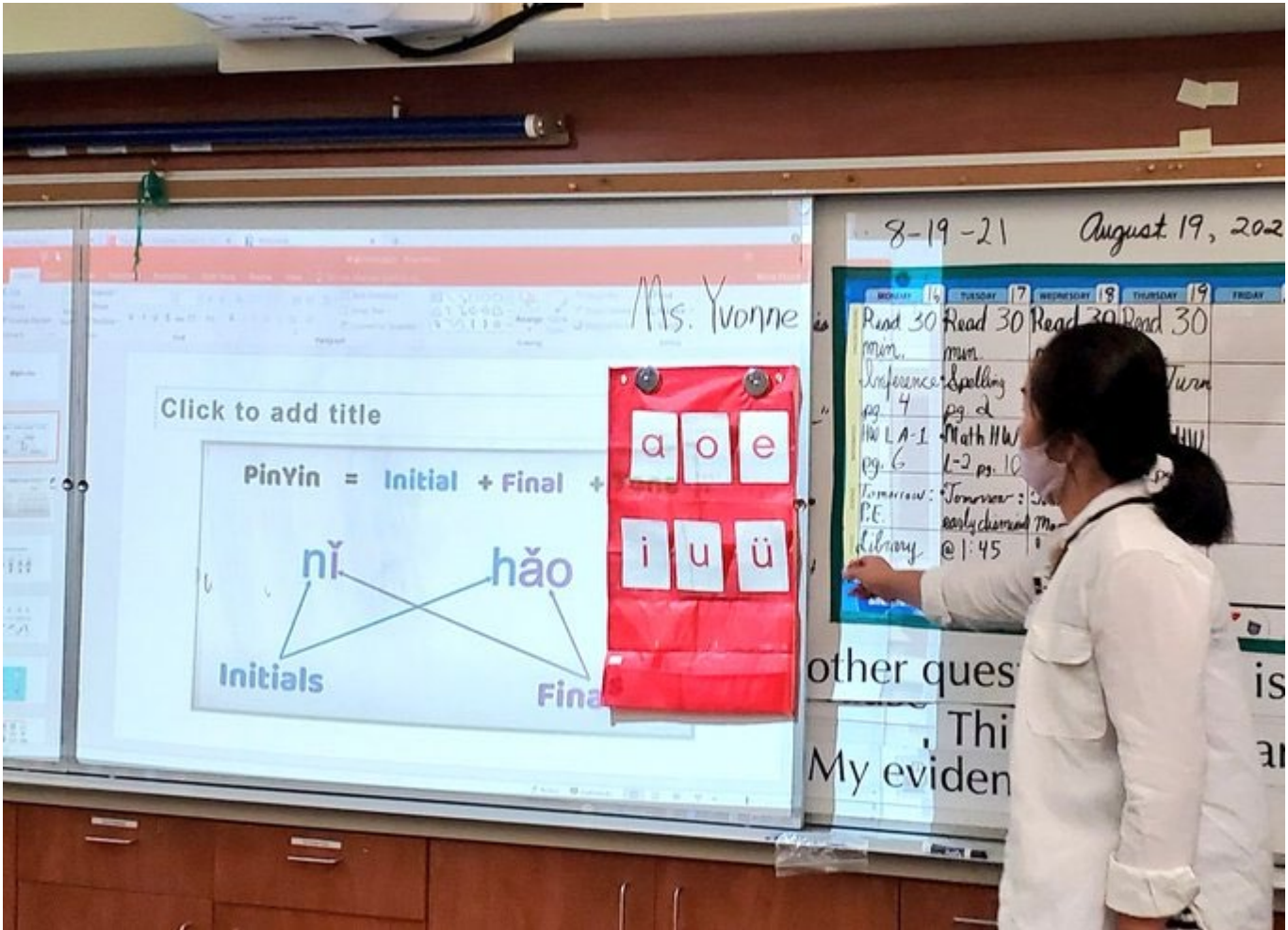

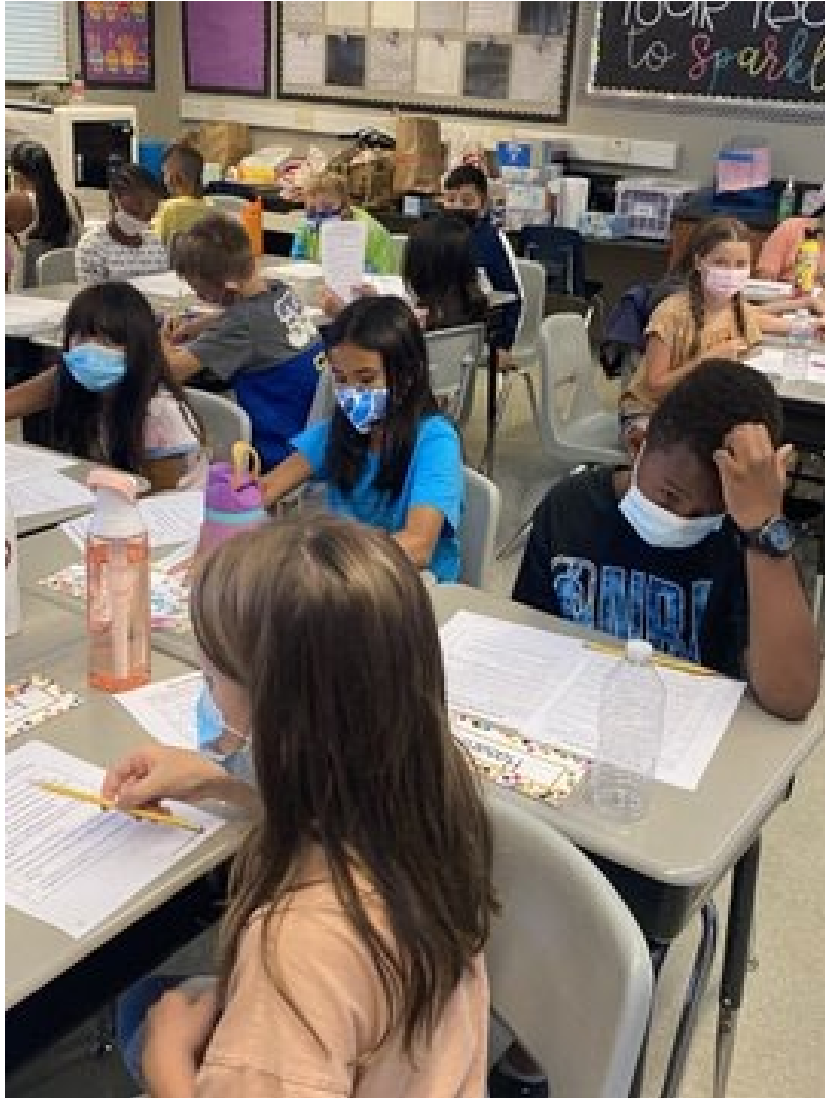

Due to a significant increase in the number of elementary students transferring into the remote independent study program, the following positions are immediately available for remote instruction from an MDUSD school site:

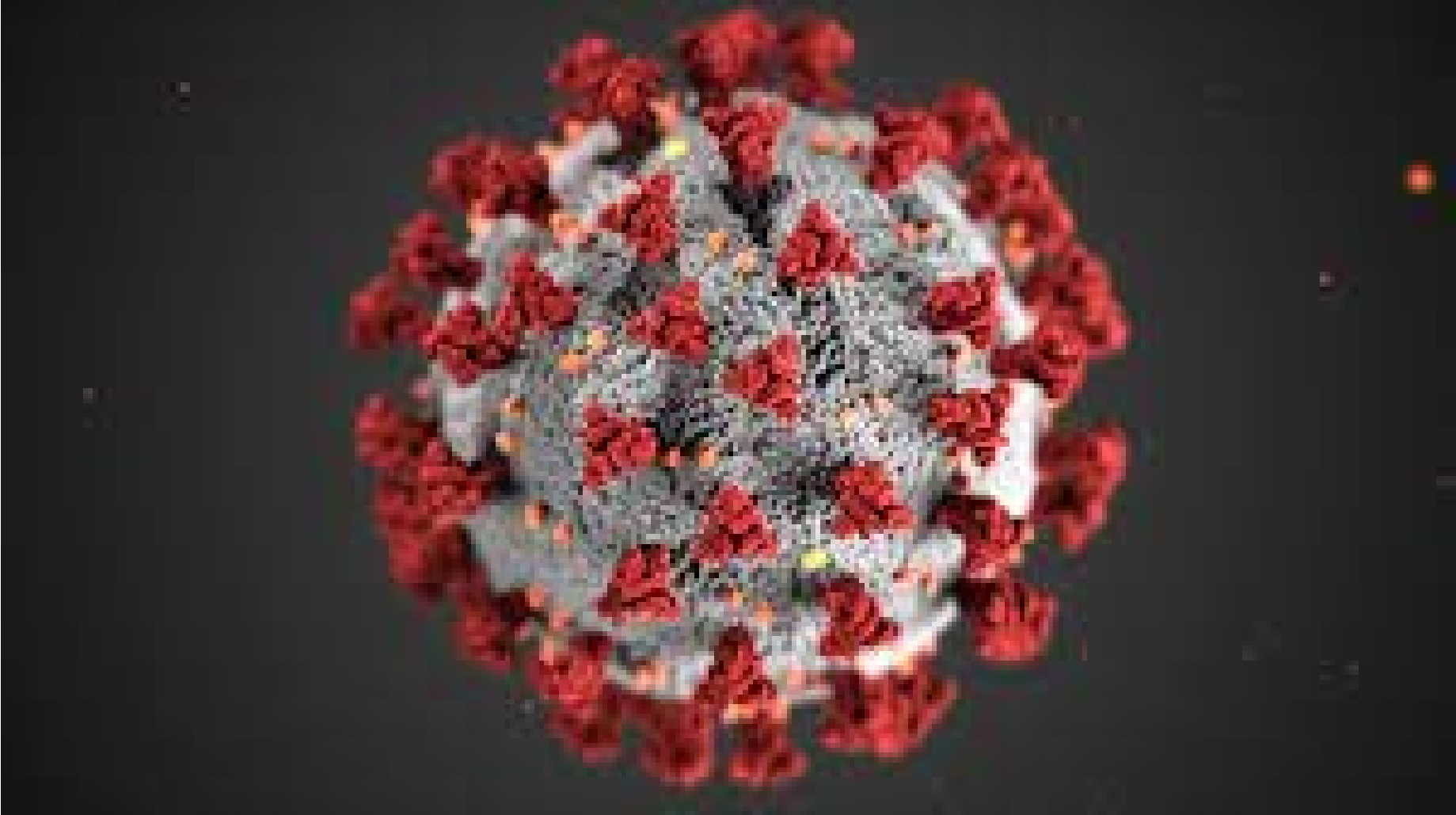

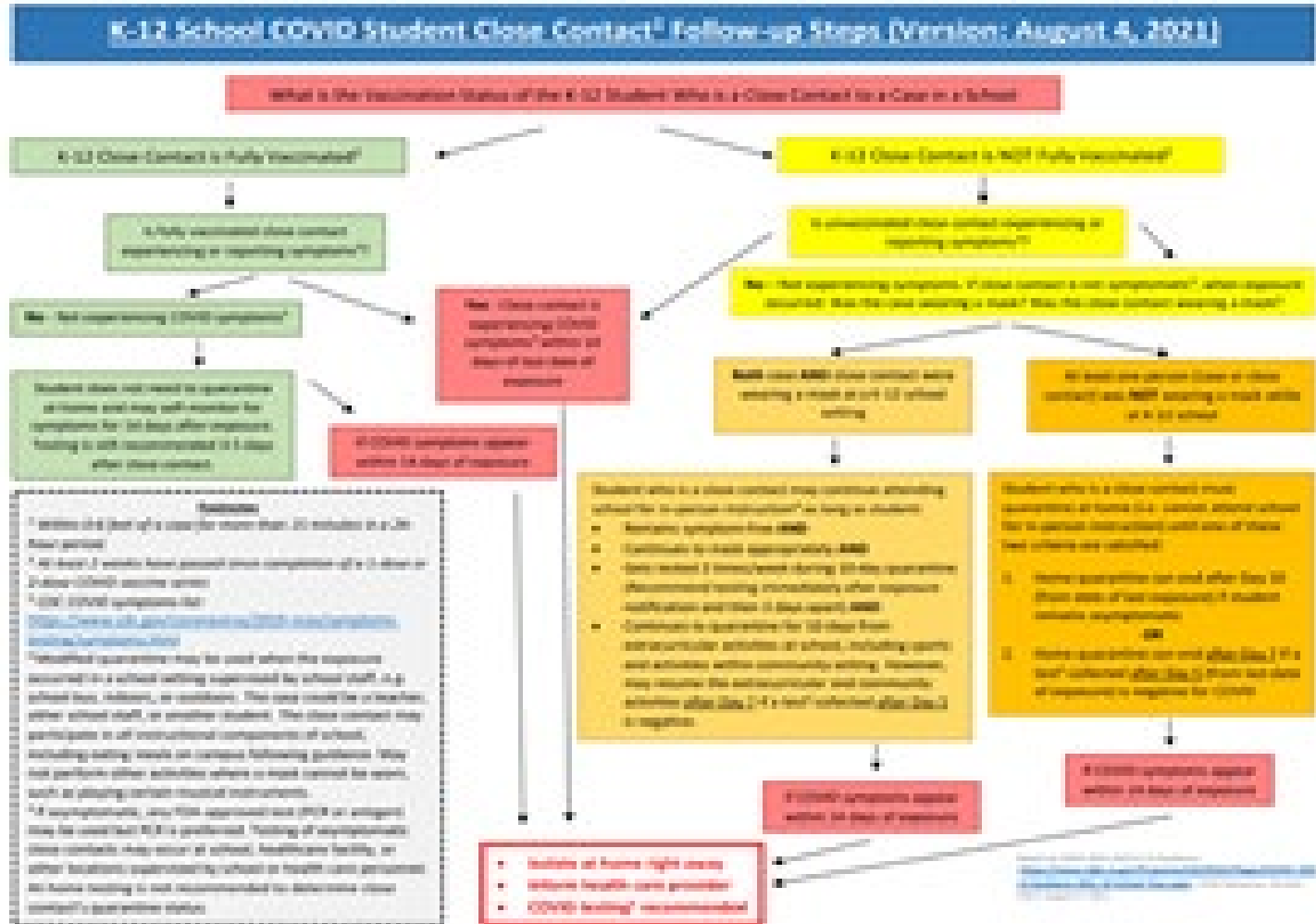
