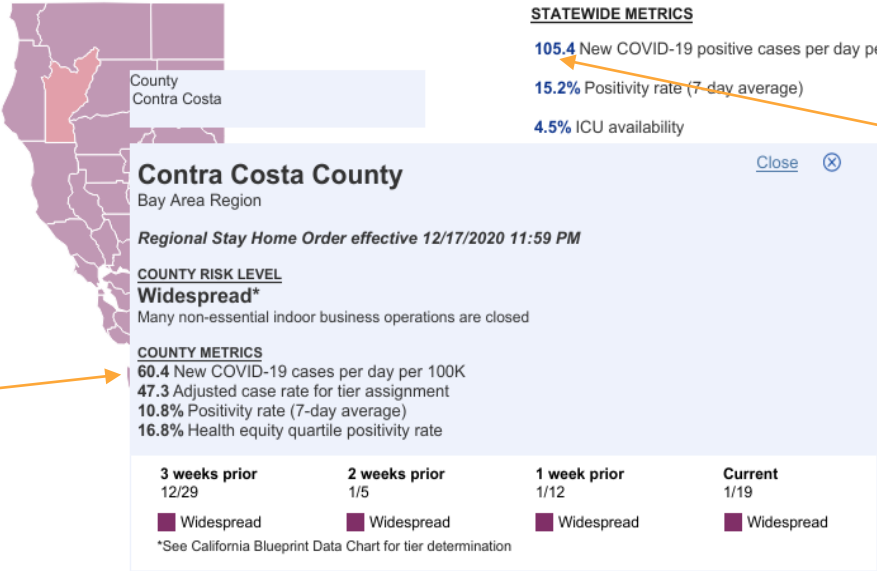

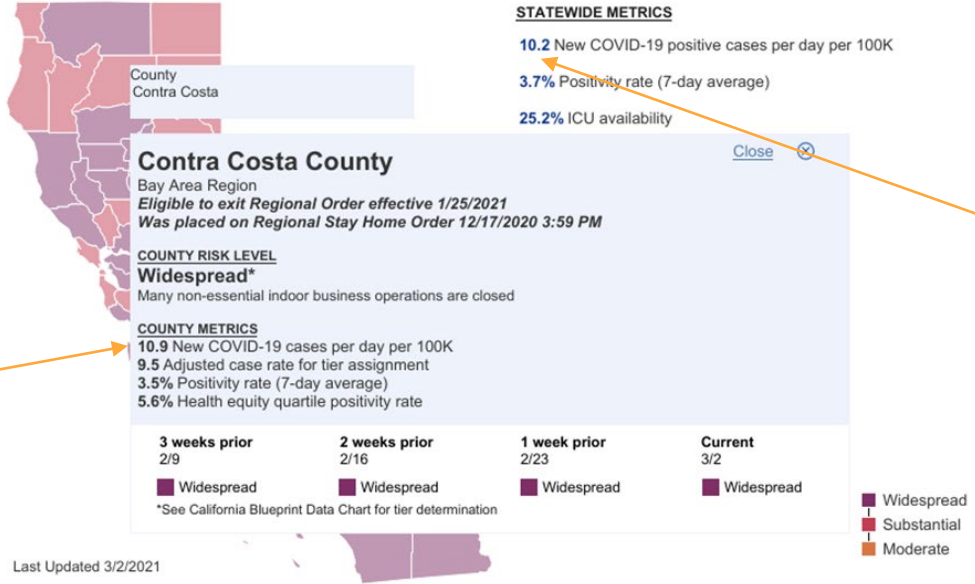

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# Positive Staff COVID Cases Reported to MDUSD

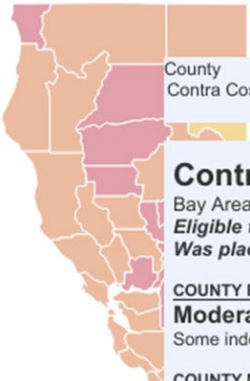

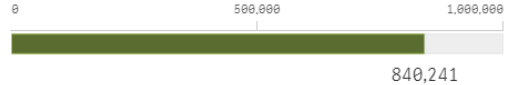

# Transportation

- Over 500 students are routed on buses

# COVID Testing Update

MDUSD has provided COVID testing for the last four weeks, In that time, over 1,550 tests have been conducted.

To date, there have been NO positive results.



# PPE's/Supplies Delivered to School Sites\*

- 100% of school sites have had MERV 13's installed in classrooms.
- 95 HEPA purifiers have been delivered to school sites.
- 10,250 containers of hand sanitizer; 1,728 gallon refills sent to school sites and departments.
- 536 touchless thermometers
- 19,104 face shields
- 487,467 student reusable and disposable masks
- 337,320 adult reusable and disposable masks
- 13,500 disposable gowns

# Fall 2021 Survey

I plan on having my student return to MDUSD for the 2021-2022 school year.

- Regular Full time In-Person instruction (Preschool-12th grade): Five days a week of full day instruction at your school of residence or attendance.



# Alternative Program: Specifically for students who need to continue in a distance learning format

- Horizons: Home Study (K-8th grade) - Parents/guardians assume the responsibility for their students' learning and for the management of curriculum. Student and parents/guardians meet with teacher(s) every other week for support and monitoring purposes.
- Horizons: Independent Study (9th-12th grade) - Students meet with their teacher(s) at a minimum of one (1) hour per week to review assignments, progress, assess skills, and develop a graduation plan.



# Alternative Program: Specifically for students who need to continue in a distance learning format

- Mt. Diablo Virtual Academy (K-12) - New for District Residents for the 2021-22 school year. An alternative school for students who, due to health or other concerns, want to continue in a distance learning environment. The school day includes daily contact with classroom teachers utilizing both synchronous and asynchronous digital instruction, combining for a school day that will be approximately the same as the length of a school day for in-person students.



# Alternative Program: Specifically for students who need to continue in a distance learning format.

- At the elementary level, language arts, math, science, physical education, history, and science will be provided.
- At the secondary level, all core subjects will be offered with limited electives dependent on the number of students enrolled. Special Education services will be available in a virtual format as identified in student's IEPs. Students enrolling in the Mt. Diablo Virtual Academy will submit an Intra District Transfer form and be disenrolled from their home school.



# Alternative Income Forms

- November - December: Staff made a concerted effort to obtain alternative income forms for all families when the Federal Government implemented its “Seamless Summer Plan” for the entire 2020/2021 School Year.
- The forms allowed us to allow qualified students to be counted in our district’s funding model.
- As a result of the efforts, we were able to secure \$721,000 in funding we would have lost for the 2021/2022 school year.
- A big thank you to our office staff and Food and Nutrition team who assisted with form collection.
