

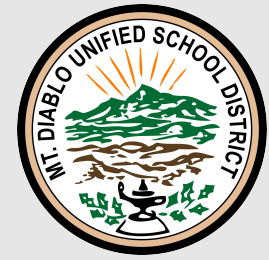

National and Local Data

2022

- In 2022, 109,680 **persons in the U.S. died from drug overdoses (average 300 deaths per day)**
 - **82,998 involved opioids**
- **183 opioid-related overdose deaths in Contra Costa County in 2022**

- **Fentanyl** is a synthetic opioid approved for treating severe pain, such as advanced cancer pain.
- **Illicitly manufactured fentanyl** is the main driver of recent increases in synthetic opioid deaths.
- A dose of fentanyl the size of Abraham Lincoln's beard on a penny can be **fatal**.

Signs of an Opioid Overdose & How to Use Narcan to Save a Life

- **Loss of consciousness**
- **Slow, shallow breathing**
- Fingernails or lips blue or purplish black
- Small, pinpoint pupils
- Can't rouse or unable to speak
- Body limp
- Face pale or clammy
- Choking sounds or snore-like gurgle

‘No child should be dying’: Fentanyl-related deaths among kids rising, Yale study says

“I’ve talked to families, and they say it’s the first time the kid ever used a drug. They didn’t even know they were using fentanyl, and then they’re gone,” said Dr. Keith Humphreys, a professor of psychiatry and behavioral sciences at Stanford University.

According to the study, 43.8% of deaths among people under 20 occurred at home.

About 87.5% of those overdoses were unintentional, and benzodiazepines were found in 17.1% of cases.

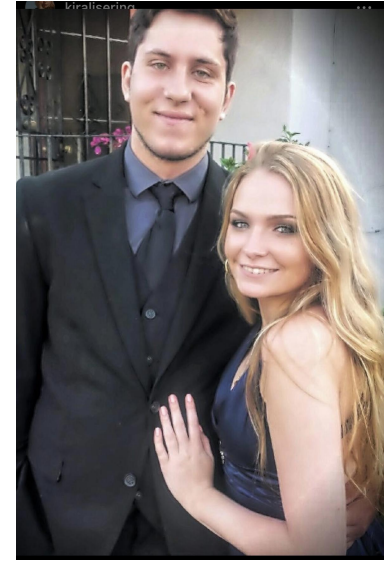
