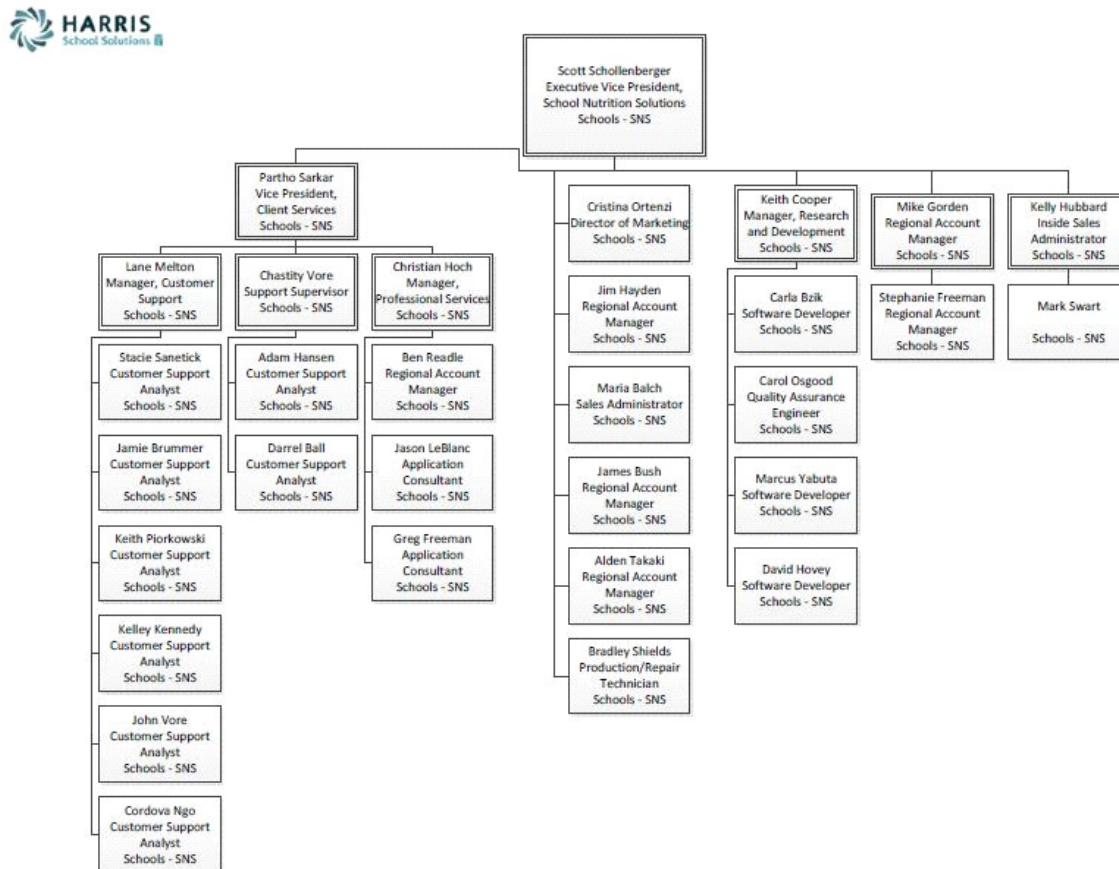

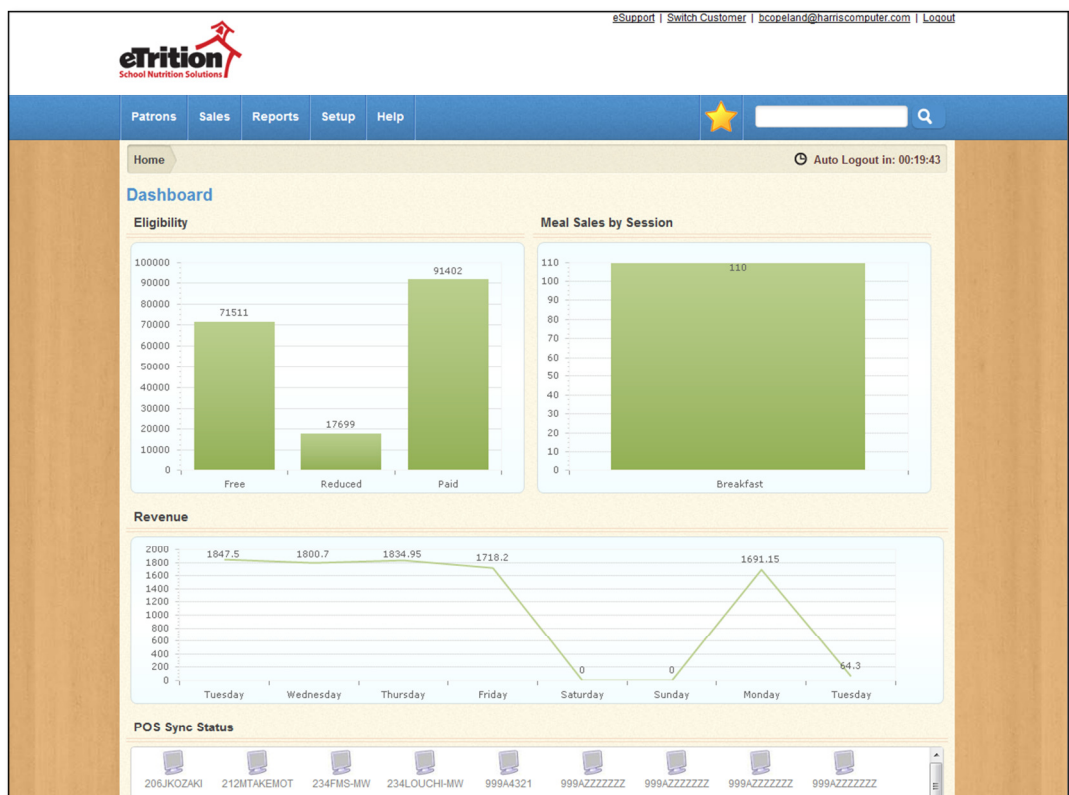

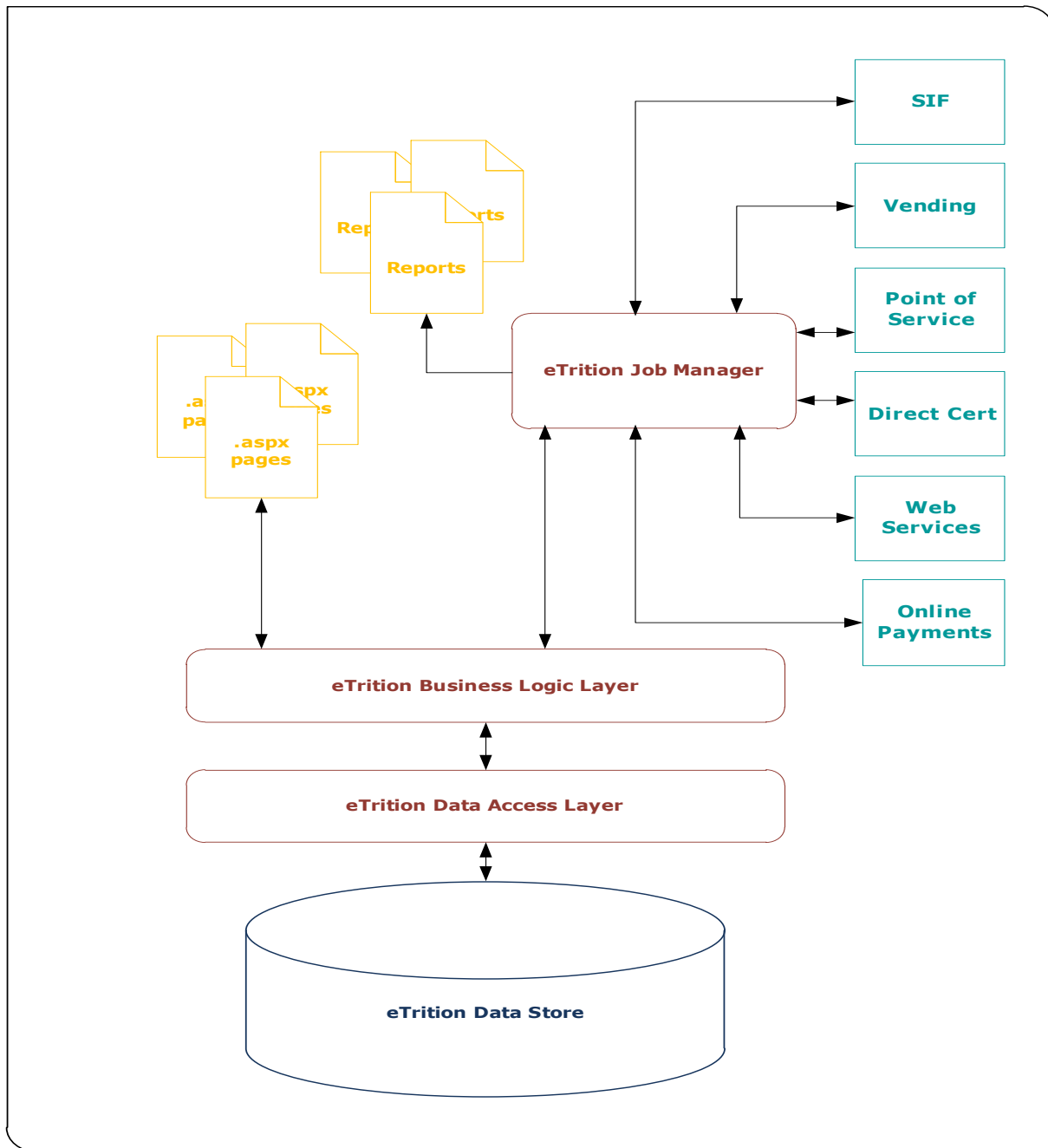

This framework, known as the School Nutrition Solutions Framework (SNSF), provides an exceptional combination of performance, scalability, fault-tolerance, and flexibility that permits clients to tailor the hardware, software, and design of their eTritition solution in the most cost-effective and seamless manner.

Through SNSF, the eTritition solution specifically makes use of the latest web technologies, including JavaScript, HTML, and XML. The application has a multi-tier, component-based architecture, with a clear separation between the presentation, business logic, and data access layers, as presented below in Exhibit: eTritition Architecture. Such architecture provides for great flexibility, which permits seamless integration with disparate systems. Building eTritition on the proper architecture provides for a highly scalable system with the ability to meet the needs of implementations of all sizes with an unlimited number of students, sites, and serving line. eTritition runs over standard high speed networks; all updates are applied to the centralized server.

Implementation & Training

The Harris implementation strategy is rooted in the belief that minimizing the impact of the implementation on students and staff is of utmost importance. Another key component is the utilization of the most efficient and cost effective methods for successful deployment.

Project Management Kickoff Meeting

The Project Management Kickoff Meeting provides the opportunity for your district representatives and Harris project teams to establish a relationship and agree on the procedures which will lead to a successful implementation. The kickoff meeting initiates the discovery process to learn more about the district's specific needs, and will allow Harris to customize the implementation to meet and surpass those needs. During this meeting the district will describe their current processes, their desired future processes, and identify:

- Processes that are unique to schools and/or serving sites
- Data needed for peripheral systems, which will be the system of record (SIS, 3rd party vendor, etc.), and the flow of that information

Understanding the district's workflow allows the project team to make recommendations for the best use of the application to fulfil the current needs and facilitate future processes.

The kickoff meeting will also allow the Project Manager to identify data needed from the district to configure their eTrition environment. The configuration includes, but is not limited to:

- Application Setup - to configure the information for Free & Reduced applications,
- Buildings Setup - to configure schools and/or serving sites including calendars, grades, and report groups,
- Customer Setup - to enter the district's address and contact information as well as identify the use of LDAP and POS & Atom Proxies, as needed,
- Data Imports - to establish configurations for ongoing, periodic, and/or one time imports for student data,
- Data Exports - to identify and plan for exports that are needed for 3rd party systems or other reporting,
- Patron Information - to populate tables for collecting patron data such as allergies, balance types, enrollment types, and configuration for application verifications,
- Point of Sale (POS) Configuration - to set up terminals, pricing, pricing groups, meal service layouts, discounts, configure terminals, and install the POS,
- Reports Setup - to select multiple reports that will be generated by using the one-click End-of-Day Reports feature,

- Sales Data - to set up item groups, labor hour equivalency, payment types, reimbursements, sales items, and sales taxes,
- System Configuration- to create users and identify their roles and school groups, and synchronize EZMealApp (online applications) and EZSchoolPay (online payments and parent portal), as needed.

Lastly, during the kickoff meeting, the teams can review/confirm the district's hardware and systems requirements as well as review the dates and number of sites to be rolled out proposed on the project plan. The information gathered at the kickoff meeting will be used by the Project Manager to summarize the meeting and make adjustments to the project plan as needed; the primary focus is ensuring that schools go "live" within a reasonable and agreeable timeframe. Following the kickoff meeting, an Application Consultant will be assigned to the project and will work with the Project Manager to follow-up on items/information needed for the implementation.

During the implementation phase, support will be managed by the Application Consultant and other Harris staff identified by the Project Manager. The staff will review the district's specific setup, configuration, training, and reporting structure and will address the district's questions and concerns to ensure a successful implementation.

Configuration

The configuration phase begins when the project plan is finalized; the technical staff then configure the eTriton environment per the data provided and the district's intended use of the data. Following the configuration, a meeting will be conducted to review the completed environment for a final sign-off before the training phases begin.

Training and Support

The training portion of the implementation will be broken into two major categories: Central Office Training and Site Level Training and Support.

Central Office Training

The district's technical staff will be trained to maintain their eTriton hardware and software. The training will include software upgrades and periodic hardware maintenance. The training is tentatively scheduled to occur immediately following the configuration phase but may be scheduled for later in the project plan as needed.

The district's Central Office users will be trained on the Back Office features of eTriton. This version of Back Office training is designed for staff who are responsible for the management of food services at the district level.

Site Level Training and Support

Site level training is a combination of Site Level Back Office training and POS training. Site Level Back Office training is for Site Managers who, depending on the district, may be responsible for verifying cash counts, eligibility, and/or generating site level reports. The POS training is for any staff which will process patron sales transactions, crediting patron accounts, and/or voiding transactions. POS training can be customized to meet

the needs of cashiers or Site Managers. The training focuses on the day-to-day functions for multiple serving sessions in a day, patron specific needs that may arise during these sessions, and the closing of each day's serving sessions.

Depending on the district's wishes and ability to support the go-live activities at each school, Harris prefers to train the Central Office staff first followed by a Train/Go-Live approach for the sites. This type of training supports the just-in-time training allowing the site users to use their newly learned skills on the next business day. This also allows the district to manage the overall change in phases.

Harris is also willing to provide a train-the-trainer approach to minimize training costs if desired.

During the implementation phase, support will be managed by the Application Consultant and other Harris staff identified by the Project Manager. The staff will be informed of the district's specific setup, configuration, training, and reporting structure; Harris' primary goal will be to ensure that the district's questions and concerns are addressed timely to contribute to its successful implementation.

Initial Training Option –“Train/Go-live Method”

With this option, Harris proposes to train one school each day on the POS and then support each school the day following training with go-live. This is the optimal solution because it provides an immediate opportunity for each school to put their training to use and it allows the Harris trainer to fully support each school on their first day with personal attention. This method is the most expensive because it requires one day of onsite services for each school. But, we believe this “train and go-live” approach, in which the rollout is staggered over several days, offers a hands-on and personal benefit for the school trainees. In our experience it is also much preferable than attempting to train all school users at once and then going live all on the same day – something that would strain the resources of both Harris and the district.

With this method Harris would train one school on the use of the point of service in the afternoon (following the close of business on the current POS system). The Harris trainer would support the school the next day both for breakfast and lunch service. Then the Harris trainer would train the next school, repeating this cycle each day until all schools are live.

Each day, following the close of business, the district will provide a comma-delimited file from the existing POS system containing Student ID, Meal Balance, and Eligibility Code. It is assumed that the Student ID in the existing POS system matches the Student ID from the Student Information System (SIS). This file will be imported by the Harris Professional Services Team to prepare the school to go live on eTrition the following day. To condense the project and lower the total number of onsite days needed, Harris can modify this approach to train multiple schools each day. This modified approach is possible if TIPS- The Interlocal Purchasing System is willing to provide members of its staff to provide the go-live support at additional schools each day.

After the initial setup and configuration of the system (in advance of any onsite activity) the district will provide a comma-delimited file from the district's student information system. The Student ID number in the student information system must match the Student ID number in the current point of service system. Harris staff will import this data file to initially populate eTrition with all student data, including but not limited to Student ID, Student First Name, Student Last Name, School Code, Grade Code, Enrollment Start Date, Enrollment Drop Date, Homeroom, Birthdate, Gender, Parent First Name, Parent Last Name, Address,

City, State, Zip, Phone, and Email Address. (If the student information system contains the Eligibility code we will import that as well).

The onsite phase of the project would begin with training of central office staff on basic setup and navigation, free/reduced applications, reporting, purchasing, inventory, and menu planning.

Training would then move to point of service, described in the paragraphs above.

The timeline for this method is as follows (This is an example. Your schedule would be created based on your needs):

Day 1:

Central Office Training to include, but not limited to, review of setup, patron management, to confirm the auto import from the district's Student Information System, free & reduced applications, including online applications and all letters and reporting associated with free & reduced application activity.

Day 2:

Central Office Training to include, but not limited to, continue training on free & reduced applications, central inventory, and reporting.

Day 3-8:

This phase would be for point of service training in which we would train one school per day and then provide go live support for each school on the following day, as described previously.

Harris is willing to modify this approach as needed to ensure TIPS- The Interlocal Purchasing System receives the most beneficial and cost effective training.

Train-the-Trainer Method

Utilizing the train-the-trainer approach, Harris staff will train key district employees who would in turn train site users on the use of eTriton.

This approach is beneficial because it greatly reduces the number of onsite days needed by a Harris trainer. However, for this approach to be successful the district must commit to providing key employees for the time necessary to train all school-level users (and thus forego their current duties during this training and implementation phase).

The timeline for this method is as follows:

With the train the trainer approach Harris would provide two days for central office training (as discussed above). In addition, Harris would provide 4-6 days of training for "train the trainer" instruction for those district employees who will be tasked with training school site users. This training will focus on the use of the point of service, including input devices, POS options, troubleshooting, end-of-day activities and reporting, and a special emphasis on supporting the school site

users as they go live on the new system. Three days are proposed to fully accommodate all district trainers and to provide contingency for any emergencies that may come up during training.

Online Training or Tutorials

Harris staff can provide online training or re-training at any time during the implementation of the project. Online training means that a Harris trainer will connect with the customer via a web screen-sharing session to provide instruction and live support on questions or issues.

Online training is very effective to provide “refresher” training and clarification for new users immediately after go-live on the new system.

Additionally, eTriton software modules provide complete on-screen help documentation that is context sensitive.

Proposed Project Team

The project team will consist of a Project Manager and an Application Consultant. During the life of the implementation, the project will be supported by any number of personnel from our Support and/or Development teams at the request of the Project Manager.

- The Project Manager has full oversight of the project from start to finish. He/she is responsible for, but not limited to, communication with the customer (including the kick-off call), defining the project plan, ensuring the implementation is on schedule, and ensuring allocated resources are on task.
- The Application Consultant is responsible for, but not limited to, system setup/configuration, customer training and support, recommended process improvements, and the timely communication of any potential risks to the Project Manager.

Technical Specifications

Server Specifications

No server(s) are required if the district chooses our Software as a Service (SaaS) Cloud offering. If the district chooses to host eTriton within the district, a 64bit server to support IIS and SQL is required. The minimum server specifications are listed in the table below. Depending on district technology and security requirements, the SQL and Application servers can reside on the same physical box. In addition, eTriton supports Hyper-V and VMWare virtualization.

eTriton utilizes Microsoft Windows Server 2012, Internet Information Services (IIS), and Microsoft SQL 2012. No additional software outside of the core operating system is required on the servers for reporting, networking, etc.
